## Youth Dies From Crash Injuries

Seventeen year old Kenneth J. Gillingham died Monday, Nov. 11 at Oconomowoc Memorial Hospital from injuries he received Nov. 9 in an auto accident near Ixonia.

Gillingham was the driver of a car owned by Gerald J. Helman, Ixonia, which left Hill Road one mile north of Ixonia and overturned at 1:15 a.m. Saturday. Steve Helman, 17, Ixonia, a passenger, escaped with minor injuries. Cause of the accident has not been determined.

Funeral services took place Wednesday, Nov. 13 at St. Jerome Catholic Church officiated by the Rev. Robert Bales. Burial was in St. Jerome Cemetery. Friends called at the Notbohm Funeral Home after 4 p.m. on Tuesday, Nov. 12 and there was an 8 p.m. Parish Vigil Tuesday.

Gillingham had resided at 444 American St. in Ixonia and was a senior at Oconomowoc Senior High School. He was born Aug. 22, 1957 in Cudahy, the son of Kenneth J. Gillingham Sr. and Lorraine Vogl Gillingham. A resident of Ixonia for seven years, he had also lived in South Milwaukee.

## James C. Haines, 16 Is Train Victim

### Youth Killed While Walking On Tracks Near His Home

James C. Haines, 16, 305 West South Street, was killed instantly Wednesday afternoon, April 3, when he was struck by the engine of a westbound Milwaukee Road freight train.

The accident occurred at 3:05 p.m. between the South Main and Worthington Street crossings.

According to Richard B. Pierce, Greenfield, engineer, he observed the youth walking on the west bound tracks. Pierce said he sounded the warning horns and electronic bells but the youth gave no indication that he heard the train approaching. The engineer applied the emergency brakes when it became apparent that the youth was not going to step aside. The train stopped about 154 feet west of the point of impact.

Coroner Donald Eggum ruled

the death an accident. The Haines family resides very near the tracks and the youth may have been so used to hearing passing trains that he literally did not hear the warning horns and bells, officials said.

James was the son of Frank and Barbara Rush Haines, and was born July 25, 1957. He was a lifelong resident of Oconomowoc and was a junior at Oconomowoc Senior High School.

He is survived by his parents, two brothers, Jeffry and John, and two sisters, Kim and Kelly, all of Oconomowoc; his grandparents, Mrs. Eric (Phoebe) Klenzendorf, Oconomowoc, Chester Rush, Milwaukee, and Roy Haines, Sharon, Mass.

Funeral services were held Saturday at 1:30 p.m. at the Notbohm Funeral Home with the Rev. Lawrence Price officiating. Burial was in Glenview Memorial Gardens, Ixonia.

This is the first train connected fatality in Oconomowoc in almost 10 years.

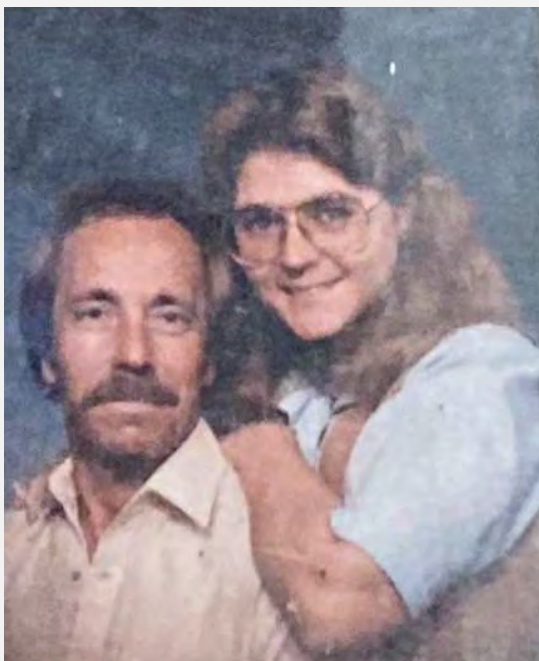

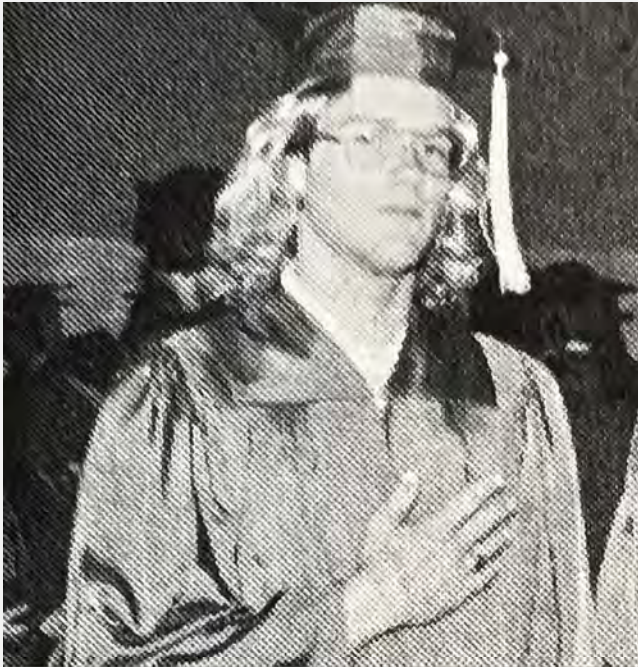

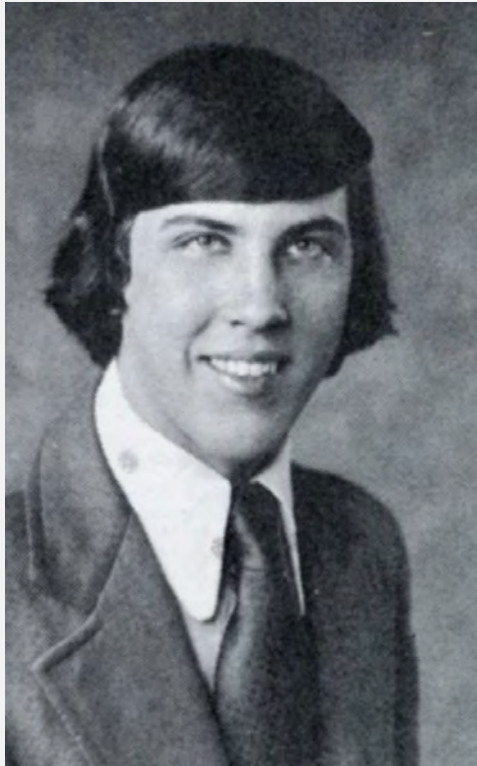

### " Two die in car-train crash on Silver Lake St.

Two Oconomowoc area young men, John A. Kalbus III, 20, 889 Elm Ave., Okauchee, and Dale D. Kaempf, 22, 434 Harvard St., were killed instantly at 12:31 a.m. Tuesday, April 10, when the car in which they were riding was struck by the engine of Amtrak Train No. 9. The accident occurred at the Milwaukee Road crossing on Silver Lake St. According to Patrolman Karl

Lorenz, who witnessed the accident, the car driven by Kalbus turned on to Silver Lake St. from a parking lot, and headed south. The car did not slow or stop although crossing gates were down and warning signals operating. Kalbus drove around the crossing gates and then accelerated, according to Lorenz. The engine of the train, which was westbound, struck

the car near the center of the left side. The car broke in two pieces, with the rear portion being thrown about 50 feet to the west. Speed of the train was estimated at 55 miles an hour. Both victims were dead when Lorenz reached them, with both suffering massive head injuries. The fatalities are the first in a car-train accident in the city of

Oconomowoc since May, 1964, when Frank J. Kroha, Milwaukee, was killed in an accident at the S. Main St. crossing. More than 50 deaths had occurred on Oconomowoc's crossings prior to June, 1964, when the Common Council ordered the installation of stop

## 15-Year-Old Youth Dies In Crash

Bruce C. Koester, 15, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd Koester, 267 - A County Trunk O, was fatally injured Monday at 12:50 p.m., when the car in which he was riding was involved in an accident at the intersection of Mapleton Road (Highway C) and Norwegian Rd.

Bruce was a passenger in the car driven by Daniel Schmid, 17, 34551 Whittaker Rd, which was traveling south on Norwegian Rd. The car apparently failed to stop for the arterial stop sign and was struck by a pick - up truck, driven by Jerome W. Wolf, 605 Elm Street, Hartford, which was traveling east on Mapleton Rd.

Schmid was taken to the Oconomowoc Memorial Hospital and is being treated for head injuries and fractures. Wolf refused hospitalization but was treated at the Parkview Medical Center, Hartford, for facial injuries.

Bruce, who was pinned in the car, was pronounced dead on arrival at the hospital.

Services for Bruce will be held Thursday, at 2 p.m. at St. Olaf's Lutheran Church, Toland. The Rev. Lowell Sheldahl will officiate.

Bruce, son of Lloyd and Inez Rolefson Koester, was born Nov. 21, 1957. He was a junior at Oconomowoc High School.
